Dismas is Family. Dismas housing programs and services offer hope, understanding, and opportunity for men recovering and rebuilding their lives after years of addiction, incarceration, and homelessness.

Dismas House in Worcester offers supportive, transitional housing and reentry services.

The Dismas Family Farm in Oakham offers vocational rehabilitation and supportive housing on a working farm.

The Father John Brooks **House** in Worcester and the **Reverend Richard and Gail** Pryce House in Oakham offer permanent, supportive housing to graduates of Dismas programs.

BAR None provides civil legal assistance to former prisoners from throughout Worcester by addressing barriers to reentry.
